School Responsibilities:

1. Follow a rigorous plan of instruction using best practices and research-based strategies.
2. Meet regularly to monitor the progress of individual students and develop individual learning goals as needed.
3. Establish at least 3 formal parent conference times during the year to discuss student progress and plans for improvement.
4. Develop and maintain a consistent routine of communicating with parents.

Parent Responsibilities:

1. Communicate regularly with teachers using Class Dojo, emails, phone calls, and personal visits.
2. Review progress reports and report cards.
3. Read at least 15 to 30 minutes each day at home.
4. Parents can enrich their children's lives and language at home by playing games with their children, doing household chores together, and just conversing with their children in informal situations.
5. Check out the weekly newsletters, school social media sites and contact the school with questions or concerns.
6. Participate in school events and attend designated parent nights.

Student Responsibilities:

1. Talk with their parents about what they are doing in school.
2. Take home important school-related notifications.
3. Ask questions and be an active participant in class.
4. Follow classroom expectations. Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Ready.
